Design philosophy	Yuppie Yuppie started in the 80's, the advertising industry is to capture the essence of a particular type of work hard, play hard, ambitious minded city career person.  People were doing well financially, but being really obvious wasn't completely acceptable, hence the statement Rolex. The other big thing was the cell phone, new at the time. And women were yuppies too! They also wore their "Power suits".  The hectic lifestyle of a yuppie meant that after long hours of work, rare free time was spent in a self-indulgent way frittering away the cash earned on anything, from expensive perfume, to a bottle of fine champagne. Conspicuous wastage was part of the attitude. The term applies to men whose ages range from about 21 to early 40s.  Yuppie-style is always matching and usually upscale. They like to flaunt their good taste. Even if the young professionals are in		

debt to their ears, they work hard to maintain the image of success. For day they sported wide shouldered jackets and for weekends they wore a Barbour to affect a country aesthetic to assume the appearance of a more advantaged lifestyle. They Wore business suits. and clothes that are considered casual, also they look for outfits in neutral colors like grey, beige and olive. Yuppies do not like to stand out with bold colors, They may end up making an unintentional statement, these are usually khakis and polo shirts. They made sure to see someone else wearing the outfit before - yuppies are conformists. They usually Carry a sweater with them by draping it over their shoulders and tying the arms loosely around the front. This should look very casual as if they put it there without a lot of though. And the sweater should never fall off or hang crooked.

## Grunge

Grunge, like almost all labels of modern rock n roll, was a label fabricated by radio stations and the MTV/music industry. It described music stripped down to its bare sound and devoid of flashy stage antics and costuming. The bands that were labeled grunge, Smashing Pumpkins, Pearl Jam, Sound Garden, Nirvana, Alice in Chains etc. were reacting to the overly produced glam rock from the late 80's and seeking out something that personified their feelings and generational angst better than Poison or Bon Jovi. It was about finding your own sound, style and place

Grunge was developed as a way to shun fashion and style but became a fashion all of its own. Colors for this are usually dark and subdued. The shoes that go with grunge look include large clunky types like combat boots.

Conclusion & reflection	There is no doubt about that the understanding of having a Yuppie or Grunge style has evolved since its coming out in the 80-90's, however the evolving has happen in terms of name changing the style and modernizing it and its values.  The yuppie style has dominated the male business world since it came out in the 80's. In offices the invented the casual Friday for example - which is the only day workers can come to work without a suit and where female can leave the high heels home. The yuppie style is also seen in another work area, flight attendance, both sexes are here dressed up to look clean and formal.  The past decades money, labels and minimalism have played an important rule on young and older generations. Since women began focusing on making a name for themselves in a "man's world" they have been wearing more men inspired clothing: pants and even their boyfriends clothing (the term boyfriend t-

shirt also come from this period). Simple plain colors as black, white, blue is a dominating color in many people's clothes, especially in Scandinavia. The need for having designer things is still dominating; however bragging or showing of is more in direct. Both men and women love having that special piece of designer cloth or accessories that will make their outfit look just a little more expensive. That being said, people feel amazing about themselves when they shop something for less the price then the product worth. The modern rock n roll has also in terms of leather mixed with vintage old t-shirt (likely to be with a band picture on, from the 80's) and then the final touch is messy hair and full eyebrows. The grunge style is likely to be dress up with some lighter colors like white and light blue or a piece of clothing in sophisticated cuts (yuppie style). Fx white men's inspired shirt with black leather pants and booths with chains on.

All of previous style generations are affecting our stile today and we like to mix the styles together and give them new names. However, it is safe to say that the Yuppie and Grunge style is affecting our style more then we knew.
